(Ethical Guidelines to Animals' Research)

	Ethical Considerations	Yes	No
1.	A clear scientific purpose is justifiable to use animals		
2.	Number of animals will not exceed the requirements of research		
3.	The process will provide unnecessary Pain or Discomfort		
4.	If chronic pain is expected, by the end of experiment the animal will be sacrificed using approved method of euthanasia القتل الرحيم		
5.	If there is surgical procedure: Anesthesia, Antibiotics and Postoperative care will be applied		
6.	Same animal will not be the subject of more than one experimental protocol		
7.	Care of animals kept for biomedical purposes will be under the supervision of veterinarians		
8.	Animals will be transported under human and hygienic conditions		
9.	Animals will receive a supply of food stuffs appropriate to their requirements, and free access to potable water.		
10.	Disposal of sacrificed animals will be consistent with health and environmental concerns		
11.	Animal used for human consumption will not be slaughtered before complete withdrawal period of drugs.		
12.	Wild animals undergo extinction will be avoided from any trial leading to their extinction		
13.	Experiments applied to fresh water fish will not pollute environment.
